About

The Vice President of The Gambia -Mohammed B.S Jallow

Education

VP Jallow had his Primary and Higher teacher's certificates from the Gambia College in 1985 and 1988, respectively. In 1991, he earned his first Degree, BA Honours in Education, specialising in Mathematics, from the University of Bristol, UK. Four years later, in 1995 gained a Master's Degree in Education and specialised in Educational Planning and Statistics from the University of Bristol, UK.

Work Experience

Mohammed B.S Jallow started as an unqualified teacher in 1980. As a Primary School Teacher, he taught all subjects on the curriculum until 1988, when he specialised in teaching Mathematics and Science. By 1992, Jallow held the position of Education Planner/Statistician, got involved in the Collection, Collation and Analysis of Educational Statistics, and three years later became a Principal Planner.

Rising the administrative cadre, Mr Jallow became Director of the Information Technology and Human Resources at the Ministry of Education. Technical adviser to Senior Management on staffing, training and ICT issues in 1998 and five year on in 2003, he became the Director of Planning, Ministry of Education and technical adviser to Senior Management on staffing, training and ICT issues. Until he was appointed Vice President of The Republic of The Gambia, Mr Jallow was Deputy Executive Director at the Senegalo-Gambia Secretariat, responsible for The Gambia.

Mr Jallow's professionalism in project management and facilitation of Goal Oriented Project Planning and Strategic Choices in Education between 1997- 2007 earned him awards and recognition from the World Bank Washington DC, RIPA, UK and Brussels, Belgium.

Mr Jallow contributed to the design, implemented an Educational Management Information System (EMIS), and introduced a staff appraisal system. The project also developed a Geographical Information System which digitally represented all schools and related data to enable management to take more informed decisions on issues of school mapping.

He also held vital responsibilities and contributed to the EDUCATION FOR ALL (EFA) Campaign, annual reviews of education expenditures to establish whether resources match policy pronouncements. He also contributed significantly to the revised Education policy in 1995 and, subsequently, developed a master plan which spelt out the inputs and cost of all the strategies to implement the policy.

A team member that prepared the 2004 -2015 Education Policy Coordinated the 2016 – 2030 Education Policy development, the Mid-Term Plan 2008 to 2011, and the Education Sector Strategic Plan 2006 to 2015, amongst other works he did.

Working at the Office of the President as Permanent Secretary of Policy Coordination and Head of the Civil Service earned him experience managing, coordinating and monitoring the Civil Service and dealing with state-owned enterprises.

Vice President Jallow Delivers Key Address at COP28 Heads of State Summit

The Vice President of The Gambia, His Excellency Mohammed B.S Jallow attended the Conference of the Parties of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change - COP28 in Dubai. On December 2nd, 2023, the Vice President delivered a pivotal address at the Heads of State Summit.

COP is a series of United Nations climate change conferences where world leaders, negotiators, and stakeholders gather to discuss and collaborate on global efforts to address climate change. Each COP meeting plays a crucial role in advancing international climate agreements and strategies.

Commencing his statement, VP Jallow expressed gratitude to the United Arab Emirates on behalf of His Excellency Adama Barrow, President of The Republic of The Gambia, for the warm reception.

Highlighting the pervasive impact of climate change on a global scale, VP Jallow reiterated The Gambia's unwavering commitment to a sustainable future. He emphasized the nation's dedication to transitioning towards a low-carbon economy and promoting green energy and eco-friendly technologies.

Providing insights into The Gambia's proactive measures, the Vice President shared that the country updated its Nationally Determined Contribution in December 2021. Moreover, in compliance with the Paris Agreement, The Gambia submitted its Long-Term Climate-Neutral Development Strategy 2050 (LTS) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in September 2022.

"In addition, we are working on local adaptation measures that range from reinforcing flood mitigation infrastructure, to implementing climate-resilient agricultural practices, including the recently launched climate-smart agricultural projects, climate-resilient fisheries and adaptive capacity strengthening of our rural populations, through climate-resilient and diversified livelihoods," the Vice President highlighted, adding, "these actions are vital for safeguarding our people and ecosystems".

However, the Vice President noted that despite these local efforts, financial constraints pose a significant hurdle to comprehensive action. He urged developed nations to fulfil commitments and increase support for vulnerable nations grappling with the impact of climate change.

In conclusion, VP Jallow emphasized the role of education and awareness in fostering a collective response to climate challenges. He urged active participation, stating, "We must educate our citizens about climate change, foster a sense of stewardship, and inspire them to participate actively in our efforts to transition and adapt."

Diplomatic Endeavors in Education: The Gambia's VP Visits Rwanda



Protection Meeting Kicks Off in The Gambia: VP Jallow Advocates Regional Unity to Combat Poverty and Inequality



On Tuesday, November 21, 2023, The Vice President of The Republic of The Gambia, His Excellency Mohammed B.S Jallow, delivered the welcoming address at the ECOWAS Meeting of Experts and Ministers of Social Protection held at the Sir Dawda Kairaba Jawara International Conference Centre in Bijilo.

During his speech, the Vice President stressed the significance of adopting a regional approach to social protection, aligning with the principles of the African Charter on Human and Peoples' Rights. He urged experts to focus on the commitment to harmonized policies, referencing the 2018 Social Protection Framework draft and highlighting the impact of the pandemic on the need for refined strategies. The Vice President also emphasized the global disparities in social protection coverage, underscoring the imperative of intensified efforts to address poverty and inequality within the sub-region.





Reaffirming The Gambia's dedication to international human rights declarations, the Vice President outlined the National Social Protection Policy and the newly formulated National Development Plan, emphasizing social protection as a key priority. Furthermore, VP Jallow expressed gratitude to partners, including the International Labour Organization (ILO), Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), World Bank, and civil society organizations, and called for collective action to ensure the inclusivity of the framework.

"I remind you of our commitment and target priority group for social protection in line with Pillar 5 of the ECOWAS Vision 2050. This Pillar emphasizes the need to focus on vulnerable groups to ensure social inclusion and achieve sustainable development. Hence, Member States shall ensure that the Framework applies to all citizens and non-citizens, including certain migrant groups. In line with AU Protocols, social protection in the region and ensuring that no one is left behind," the Vice President concludes.

In delivering the goodwill message, UNICEF representative in The Gambia, Ms. Mariavittoria Ballotta, underscored the urgency of expanding the reach of social protection. She emphasized the abundance of positive evidence on social protection programs.

Over the next days, experts worked on the existing draft of the Social Protection Framework, serving as a key starting point for member states and partners to intensify efforts and investments in social protection to reduce poverty and inequality in the subregion.





ECOWAS Social Protection Framework & Operational Plan Finalized

Friday, 24th November, 2023 marked the end of the ECOWAS Meeting of Social Protection Experts and Ministers. Over the course of the 4-day workshop, experts diligently refined the existing draft of the Social Protection Framework. This document serves as a crucial foundation for member states and partners to enhance their commitment and investments in social protection, aiming to mitigate poverty and inequality in the sub-region.

In his closing statement, Vice President Jallow conveyed sincere gratitude on behalf of President Adama Barrow for the trust and confidence placed in The Gambia to host this pivotal meeting. The Vice President also extended appreciation to the experts for their vital contributions to the framework and operational plan.

"Leaving no one behind, let us change the narrative of social protection," the Vice President emphasized, underscoring the collective commitment to inclusivity and transformation in this critical domain.




HIGH-LEVEL DELEGATION FROM THE RAINBOW FOUNDATION MEET WITH VICE PRESIDENT JALLOW
